

Junior Cross country race reports

2019/20 Season

Third league race, 12 January 2020: Pingles Stadium and Warwickshire Championships, 04 January 2020

Due to illness, injury and other sporting commitments, our numbers were a little depleted, however six of our juniors completed the third meeting of the **West Midland Young Athletes' Cross-Country League (wmyaccl.com) 2019-2020** around the stadium on flat, boggy ground. Alice ran well, keeping the Wolverhampton and Bilston runner in sight and eventually overtaking her, while Aoife and Imogen improved their race positions.

Well done to all the athletes and, after three out of four league meetings, Sparkhill Harriers are 19th overall out of 21 teams.

County Cross Country Championships, 5 January 2019: Newbold Revel, Rugby

Four of our junior athletes took part in the Warwickshire Cross Country Championships at Newbold Revel in Rugby.

The new venue presented Lola with a course comprising fields, lakeside paths and woodland tracks; Alice was set an additional challenge of running around arable fields, while the U17s and U20s experienced the testing climb on an otherwise flat course. Our competitors experienced drizzle, sunny spells and blustery, tent-testing wind, which at least put paid to some ominous black clouds.
